**PURPOSE:**

To develop a method of control to assure assignments are current and responsibilities are met in a timely fashion.

**APPLICABILITY:**

This policy applies to all Probation and Parole Division staff.

**DEFINITIONS:**

A. Daily Reminder System: A system set forth by the probation and parole division where all matters which require a response by a particular due date are kept in a daily log, and used to remind employees that this particular task needs to be addressed prior to or on due date.

**POLICY:**

A daily reminder system shall be implemented at the district level of the probation and parole division in order to ensure the timely disposition of all matters.

The agency shall assign the resources required to ensure the submission of investigative reports within the time frame ordered by the sentencing court. **[4-APPFS-1B-02]**

**PROCEDURES: [4-APPFS-1B-02]**

- A. Each region and district office shall make use of a daily reminder system.
- B. A reminder system will be used on all matters such as pre and post-sentence reports, parole plan investigations, ECA investigations, violation reports, court actions, personnel evaluation reports, see below, that require a certain deadline for response. All due dates are calendar days.

- C. In all cases where reports or answers are required by a specific date, district offices will assure that the requesting party is notified when such specific dates cannot be met and will indicate when the completed matters can be expected.
- D. In cases where staff must request an extension to the given due date, supervisors may grant the extension, but for not more than a one-time extension, and not to exceed seven (7) days.
